The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica November 9, 2014

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

This ancient basilica in Rome commemorates the first public site of the “mother church” of Roman Christianity – a large meeting hall on the Lateran Hill donated by the Emperor Constantine. It was dedicated, in 324, under the title “Church of Our Savior.” Later, the ancient building was replaced by a new church dedicated to St. John the Baptist, popularly known as St. John Lateran. This is the pope’s church – not St. Peter’s as many believe. The Lateran Basilica is where the pope fulfills his role as bishop of the city and province of Rome.

St. Paul says we are God’s temple and God’s Spirit dwells in each of us. In the Gospel, Jesus found people selling and buying animals in the temple; the money changers trying to get richer. Jesus was angry because they turned God’s temple into a marketplace. What about us? Do we fill our lives with endless clutter – stockpiled food and household goods, trendy clothes, fancy cars? Do we fill the temple of our bodies with unhealthy food and drink, gossip, anger, busyness, endless noise and distraction? We must stop! Stop filling the God-sized space in each of us with other things. Jesus calls us to remember our dignity as a temple built of living stones, with hearts that beat for justice, peace and mercy for all people.
