## **Weekly Reflection – the Road to Discipleship Wisdom or Weeping?**

### **Sunday, November 16 - Thirty-Third Sunday In Ordinary Time**

The master distributed talents in various amounts to us, then he went away. He will return, but when? How much time do we have to account for what he has left with us? What does it mean to be ready? What do we do with the life and talents God has entrusted to us? Do we do nothing, a minimal amount, or do we do the same things the master did? The key to discipleship is to be dynamically, wholeheartedly working at what our master left for us to do: "Go, baptize, and teach; love God and neighbour; welcome the poor, the stranger, the lost, and the least."
