In the middle of the May 2016 Fort McMurray wildfire, Mary Lucia Joseph and her family were frightened. Above them the sky was red, getting darker and darker, and little pellets from the flames were showering down. Their city would soon be evacuated.

"We started praying a lot at that time, but it was hard to concentrate," said Mary. "We didn't know what to do. It was very scary."

Then her brother John received an email from his former professor Father Glenn McDonald, Chaplain of Campus Ministry at St. Joseph's College. Father Glenn asked if they were all right, if they needed any help, and ended up arranging for the family to take refuge at a college residence.

"In an uncertain situation like that, they were like angels

who were coming to help us because we were really scared and we didn't know what was going to happen to us," said Mary . "It was amazing how they were helping us and other families too."


The college community put out a call for donations to help the evacuees, and people responded generously.

"Everything we needed was coming in — food, clothing, toiletries — but not only the material goods; they were all easily available to talk to," Mary said. "They were all there, not just helping out with things but for emotional support as well. It was a very disturbing time for all of us to be away from our homes."

John said the response from St. Joseph's College brought him and his family closer to God.

"When things like that happen and you can see the community — everybody — coming to help you out, it's just a reassurance that God is there."
